Our Lodge is pleased to announce that we are offering a \$4,000 Scholarship for the September 2023 Semester.

(\$500 per Semester for 8 Semesters)

The son, daughter or legal ward any Allegheny Lodge member in 'Good Standing' is eligible to compete. Applications are available by calling the Lodge and must be returned on or before Friday, June 30th 2023.

RULES GOVERNING THE SCHOLARSHIP FOLLOW:

- 1. Applicant's parent/guardian must be an Allegheny Lodge member in good standing since 4/1/22.
- Applicant must be a 2023 high school graduate.
- 3. Applicant must give proof of acceptance in an accredited college or university.
- Applicant must attend college/university on full-time basis.
- Once accepted into the Lodge program the student must maintain a "C" average and submit an official grade transcript at the end of each semester.
- 6. The award is available for up to four continuous years providing funds are available*

Spotlight & Impact

Grants with goal of shining light on pressing issues facing American families, at a combined \$4500. We use the Impact Grant to provide hygiene products for distribution through Northside Common Ministries Food Pantry. We use the Spotlight Grant to purchase microwaves that will be added to future Welcome Home Kits, allowing us to make a bigger impact despite the rising prices of goods. We have distributed 306 Welcome Home Kits to veterans since getting involved in the program; for more info on this program:

Freedom

We have used this \$3K grant to purchase and distribute an average of 100 reusable bags of cleaning & hygiene products for the monthly Military Share Food Distribution organized by Veteran's Leadership Program. When finances are tough for veteran families it helps to not have to choose between food or hygiene items Watch out for volunteer bag packing events.

Beacon

\$4K grant is split between 2 projects focusing on youth and people with disabilities. First, in December we provided gifts and wrapping assistance during the annual Holiday Gift Shoppe at the Bradley Center. This is a school/housing facility for children and teens who experience trauma, mental illness, and behavioral challenges. Students get to choose gifts for their loved ones, feel empowered and experience & learn the joy of giving. Second, we'll be working with a Life Skills teacher from Shaler to take their students on a field trip to a local accessible bowling alley. These children typically cannot participate in the normal 'out of classroom' activities or sports that other students due they require special buses, teachers & aides.

Gratitude

We will work with 2 local schools to distribute summer activity backpacks to 3rd & 4th grade students. The backpacks will contain reading books, puzzles, games, brainteasers, potting soil & seeds and 3 STEM projects thanks to this \$3500 grant. This is the 2nd year for this project, which has the goal of keeping children mentally stimulated and learning while on break from classes.

SOUPER BOWL event was a great success in February. There were lot of amazing soups (and a chicken dip that somehow beat a few soups in the contest #PittsburghLife). Since TC's recipe won the Soup Bracket, we asked him to share the recipe. He says it's super easy—so give it a try!

TC's Sausage Tortellini Soup

| 1lb ground Italian sausage | 1 Yellow Onion, minced | 6 cloves garlic | 4Tbs Tomato Paste | 1 14oz can Crushed Tomatoes | 4 Cups Chicken Stock | 1 pack fresh Tortellini | 1 cup heavy cream | 1 Bunch of Kale or Spinach

Sautee the onion, sausage and garlic. Drain excess fat. Whisk in crushed tomatoes, chicken stock and tomato paste. Add salt to taste and bring to a boil, then simmer for 15 minutes. Stir in the Kale, Tortellini and Cream then cook until the kale is wilted and pasta is tender, 3-5 minutes.

Serve with sprinkled parmesan cheese and/or red pepper flakes.
